The President Corner

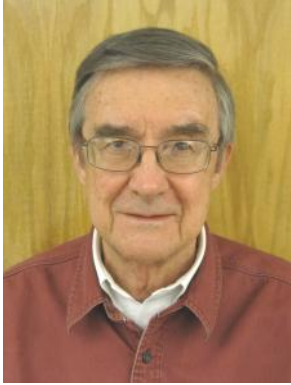

Committee Reports

Programs – Dave has enough programs lined up for the remainder of the year but needs to confirm specific dates.

Membership -- Our membership stands at 185.

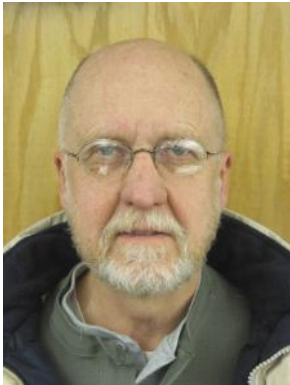
