The minutes and treasurer's report were both postponed.



### **Standing Committee Reports**

**Membership** (*Mike Kalscheur*) – 85% of members have re-upped for 2022, about our normal rate; last count 207 members/families.

Library (*Tim McAuley*) -- Tim has collected most of the books that were outstanding and has bar codes on all books. He's ready to go to introduce the new library to our members. He plans to add to the current cabinet to provide room for DVDs and has talked with *Wayne Maier* for help to build out the unit to hold them. We received 50 books from **Fox Valley** and the addition will help contain them. A motion passed to increase the library budget by \$300 to pay for the material.

**Prizes** (*Bruce Kinney*) – The door prize activity will continue to be on hold until we can have in-person general meetings.

Publicity (Keith Rosche) -- No report.

**Toys** (*George Rodgers*) – George will be contacting **Woodcraft** to find a time for a toy work session.

### **Old Business:**


- Incorporation Update: Bill has no feedback from the IRS and is unlikely to get any for a while as the tax season is in full swing with submissions already flowing in.

# February Meeting Ron Herman on Joints

Our February meeting will be Zoom only featuring *Ron Herman* talking about joinery. Ron does custom woodworking and conducts web based as well as in person classes. You may remember his presentation on clamping last June. Here is a Bio from his web site:

Ron has been working with antique and vintage tools almost all of his life - some of those tools weren't vintage, back then! From his start with and now ownership of his more than 100-year-old family

contracting company, Antiquity Builders, Ron has been sharpening, fettling, using and restoring these tools since he was ten years old. Now a master housewright, toolwright and carpenter who gained his skills through the traditional apprentice program and his own voracious thirst for knowledge, Ron uses these skills and that knowledge to teach others. From giving instructive courses to local woodworking club members to full seminars for Popular Woodworking's national Woodworking in America events, Ron's knowledge of tools has helped others grow and develop theirs.

The company mill is stocked with an tremendous tool inventory, arranged and sorted by type. Ron maintains an extensive library of tool catalogs, research and patents, dating back more than 100 years--he has researched tool patents to understand information about and the original uses of tools many may find esoteric today, and can type, catalog, and give details on hundreds of tools right off the top of his head.

Students at the Woodworking with Ron school have the use of the thousands (seriously!) of company tools. Ron's shop is basically a working tool museum, except this collection is not for show - parts of it are used every day in the normal course of business. The best part of it all is it is a true blended shop, and Ron has the expertise and skills to convey his knowledge about all of these tools to those who are interested.




