DuPage Woodworkers Board Meeting October 3, 2022

George Rodgers opened the Zoom meeting about 7:00 p.m. Present were Jim Harvey, Bruce Kinney, Bill Hoffman, Mike Kalscheur, Jeff Kramer, Mark Wieting, Howard

Peterson, Lee Nye, Tim McAuley, David Wesolowicz, Bruce Metzdorf and Jerry Johnson.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

President's Report:

George will follow up with St. James to ask how the many items DPWW contributed to the school fundraising auction were received.

Treasurer's Report:

In the absence of *Lou Meli*, George gave a brief overview of our finances. He has appointed *David Wesolowicz* as acting treasurer until a new person is elected.

Standing Committee Reports

Membership (*Mike Kalscheur*) – Mike reported that we have three new members and 199 total. About 60% of current members have renewed for 2023.

Nomination Committee - Mike has made progress in filling the slate for coming election but still needs a secretary and a little more help on AV and Publicity.

Library (*Tim McAuley*) – We have a fine resource in the library that could be used more. Tim and the board discussed a number of ways to increase ways of bringing attention to it.

Among them are moving it to the other side of the room have it referenced in the opening part of the meeting and asking Tim to write up a document describing how to access and use it.

Prizes (*Bruce Kinney*) – Prizes are about breaking even. It was affirmed we would continue, although the number will be reduced from three to two, and value of the items may need to change.

Publicity (*Keith Rosche*) – Mark will try to get newspaper coverage of the toy distribution at the

November meeting.

Nomination Committee (*Mike Kalscheur*) - Mike has made good progress in filling the slate for coming election but still needs a secretary, a toys chair, and a little more help on Toys, AV and Publicity. Members are encouraged to contact Mike if you can help out.

Toys (*George Rodgers*) – Toys will be distributed at the Nov. 21 meeting at approximately 7:45 pm. For possible use in publicizing our program, George will provide Mark a list of groups that we donate to.

Newsletter (*Jim Harvey*) – Jim set the deadline for material submission as Nov. 11. There will be a story on two recent shop visits, at *Lee Nye*'s and *Doug Carroll*'s, a book report from Tim and a story on DPWW elections at the November meeting.

From Our Workshop (*Lee Nye*) – There will be no FOW at the November meeting because of the toys distribution.

Activities (*Jeff Kramer*) – The Winter banquet will be held on Monday, December 12 at Reserve 22. The cost of the event is \$30/person after a small subsidy from the club. Reserve 22 is located at the Village Links Golf Course, 485 Winchell Way in Glen Ellyn about five blocks north of the church where we normally meet. Doors open at 6:00 serving at 6:30. both draft documents and made minor suggestions on both. The revised Constitution will be sent to the membership and voted on at the January general meeting. The revised Bylaws will be sent to the Board for its final approval.

October Meeting Recap

Vice President *Mark Wieting* conducted our meeting. He introduced DPWW member *Chad Montgomery* who gave a presentation on creating a Ukulele from scratch. Chad has a number of professional grade tools and jigs to help with the process. He thicknesses the wood for sides, top and bottom to between 70 and 80 thousandths with a hand plane. Then bends the sides around a form using a silicone heating blanket to soften the wood.

Chad then showed how he forms the neck with rasps and a spokeshave. He also has a template jig to lay out the fretboard which he cuts with a small miter box.

Book Report

Boxes, Clocks, Lamps & Small Projects

The Editors of Woodworker's Journal have put together a fun and helpful book that you might enjoy checking out.

The name of the book is Boxes, Clocks, Lamps & Small Projects and it is located in Section Red 3 of the Library (Woodworking Projects).

This is not a huge book (159 pages) and is an easy one to read in depth... or just browse thru quickly. It has a brief description of the project, scaled/detailed plans and great pictures to aid in understanding the project. Step by step instructions are easy to follow without being overly burdensome.

Also sprinkled throughout the book are "QuickTip" boxes with behindthe-scenes tips on such things as the order of laying out a project for dovetail joints, food safe finishes, tips on getting super sharp edges on your turning tools, making accurate and repeatable table saw angle cuts, non-slip workshop floors. The book also explains jigs you can make to h








Borrow Tools


