

DuPage Woodworkers Board Meeting August 7, 2023

George Rodgers opened the Zoom meeting at 7:00 Present were Jim Harvey, Bill Hoffman, Michael Kalscheur, Bruce

Kinney, Jeff Kramer, Tom Kubicka, Bruce Metzdorf, Lee Nye, Tom Olson, Howie Peterson, Harry Trainor, Dave Wesolowicz, Mark Wieting, Steve Young, John Zurales.

Agenda Additions, Changes and Approval - George noted that discussion of audio would also be included in the meeting per Jim Harvey's request. July 5 minutes were approved.

Treasurer's Report: (*Dave Wesolowicz*) - As of July 31, our bank balance is \$4,979. Members appreciated the spreadsheet that Dave had sent out prior to the meeting.

Secretary's Communication (*Steve Young*)—A thank you card was sent to *Donna Davison* on behalf of DPWW for the donation of her late husband's tools. A sympathy card was sent to *Dolores Rich* (Bernie's wife) on the passing of her husband on 7/24/23.

President's Communication (George Rodgers)

– Donna seemed pleased with the tool donation results. A picture was sent to her of an individual wearing her late husband's shop apron. The table saw and radial arm saw remain.

Standing Committee Reports:

Membership (*Mike Kalscheur*) – Membership increased by 4 last month to 204. We did lose *Bernie Rich*. Mike is preparing the notification of the 2024 renewal of dues.

Library (*Tim McAuley*) – *Tom Kubica* indicated that he had walked through the library process and has all the supplies. He has two sets of keys to the library cabinet. One set will be given to George at the next meeting. Tom has access to the program and can see any online requests. *Tom Olson* has indicated that he is willing to assist.

Prizes (*Bruce Kinney*) – At the July meetings, \$205 worth of tickets were sold. This brings the year-to-date

profit to \$625. Prizes are on hand through the September meeting.

Publicity – Absent.

Toys (*George Rodgers*) – Second workshop planned for September 30. Several people volunteered to assist in preparing for the workshop. *Harry Trainor* is donating 200 dolls for the program.

Newsletter (*Jim Harvey*) – Materials for the next newsletter are needed by Friday, August 11. Content will include the 12 FOW projects submitted, pictures from the Garfield Farm antique tool show, a directory of sawmills and lumber suppliers in Illinois, an article on the dues increase, Beads of Courage boxes and program for August.

From Our Workshop (*Lee Nye*) — Three \$20 gift cards were purchased from Woodcraft for presenters. We should maybe approach *Mark Hubl*, who works at Rockler. He has already donated several items to the DPWW.

Activities (Jeff Kramer) – The August activity was the Garfield Farm antique tool show. September's activity will be the toy workshop at Woodcraft. October's activity (10/5 - 10/7/23) will be the trip to Des Moines, IA including visits to Kreg Tools, Wood Magazine and Woodsmith Magazine. Arrangements are being finalized.

Programs (*Jeff Kramer*) – A program on hand planes is occurring in August. The November program on chair building may be moved to September due to the November meeting being used for the toy program.

A/V (Howard Peterson) — A number of issues were raised with the audio quality from the last meeting. Jim stated he could not understand many of the FOW presenters. Additionally, people on the Zoom call indicated that there was an echo. A number of ideas and suggestions were discussed including more active directions given to the presenters in staying close to the microphone, getting a taller microphone stand, use of a second headset, clip on microphones, etc. The echo problem may be improved by muting all Zoom participants. If they have questions or comments, they could "raise their hand" to be unmuted or could send in a chat message.

Web (Bill Hoffman) – There has been increased use



of the classified ads recently. John Zurales had several suggested changes to the website including updating a section on the lifetime members, a section on the 501(c) (3) status of the organization and a better definition of the DPWW (a Charitable Organization . . .), and some additional information on the toys program that includes more pictures and a link to a past local news broadcast. John will finalize the edits and send to George for final approval.

Old Business:

Adding non-profit info to the website – See above Web item.

New Camera? – Howie is not sure we need a new camera. Some suggestions / ideas surfaced and will be discussed offline.

Liability insurance – George indicated that we will have a new, more responsive representative, **Don Sinnott**, beginning September 1. All insurance will remain with the same carrier (West Bend Mutual Insurance).

New Business:

Calvo Woodcarving School Promotion – George was – Steve Young

contacted by Calvo Woodcarving. They are offering our members a \$50 discount on their courses if we promote their organization via our website and social media. The consensus was not to engage in this. Perhaps a section could be set up on the website for ongoing member benefits that this may fall into.

Bull Valley Maker's Fair – George indicated that this group has offering a 10'x10' area at their event for a fee of \$25. The space could be used for the selling of crafts made by our members and to promote the DPWW. The event will be in Woodstock on September 16. The general consensus was that George should work with members interested in participating, but not to do anything as an official DPWW event.

Beads of Courage – Mark has tried to contact the representative at Advocate Hospital but that person has not responded. It has now been over a month. We currently have around 50 boxes. George will attempt to contact the national Beads of Courage organization for assistance.

SketchUp Zoom Class.

On July 19, we held a Zoom SketchUp introductory class. John Martin led the session of six participants. as he discussed and demonstrated the basic functions of the SketchUp software. The participants had SketchUp on their own systems and were able to follow him while working on each procedure. The topics covered were selecting the template, toolbars, basic rectangle, precise rectangle with a hole, making a component, and viewing the project.

The participants commented that they found the program to be interesting and useful and would be interested in future sessions. There are two more basic sessions that will be held on August 14 and 28. When these are completed, we will determine what the next steps will be. - **Jeff Kramer**

Dues for 2024

The DPWW Board of Directors has agreed to increase annual dues from \$25 to \$30 per year for the upcoming year. The DPWW club tries to keep costs to a minimum while pursuing our charitable and educational goals. Here are some of the reasons behind our decision:

- Increased cost of toy making due to rising lumber prices. The cost of toy lumber and supplies doubled from 2021 to 2022. Costs for 2023 are expected to exceed 2022's totals.
- Our liability insurance policy did NOT previously include Directors and Officers coverage. We added this standard and customary coverage to our policy as of June, 2023, which will increase our insurance premium by \$450 per year going forward.
- In 2022, the club invested substantially to upgrade the club's audio/visual equipment. This upgrade improved our live presentations and enabled members to access meetings via Zoom.
- The club's cash balance has decreased by over 40% since the end of 2020.
- Annual dues have remained at \$25/year since our 1994 inception, while most of our costs have increased over this time.

The dues increase is expected to increase revenues by about \$1,000 per year and will help us better match revenues with expenses going forward.

Logo Clothing




