### **DuPage Woodworkers Board Meeting March 4, 2024**

*George Rodgers* opened the Zoom meeting at 7:00 Present were Gordon Brand, Jim Harvey, Bill Hoffman, Michael Kalscheur, Jeff Kramer, Tom Kubica, Bruce Metzdorf, Lee Nye, Harry Trainor, Dave Wesolowicz, Mark Wieting, Steve Young.

**Agenda Additions, Changes and Approval** - No additions or changes. February minutes were approved.



**Treasurer's Report:** (Dave Wesolowicz) – A detailed spreadsheet of finances had been distributed to the Board prior to the meeting. As of February 29, the club has \$6604 in its accounts. Dave stated that he had filed the IRS tax forms and had also completed the Illinois annual filing.

#### **Standing Committee Reports:**

Membership (Mike Kalscheur) – As of March 1, about 30 past members had not renewed their annual dues and have been removed from the roster. There have been three (3) new members join in February which brings the total membership to 197. Most of the non-renewals had joined within the last 2 to 3 years. It was requested that the list of non-renewals be circulated to the Board.

Activities (*Jeff Kramer*) — On March 16, there will be a trip to Raw Heartwood in West Chicago. Jeff will arrange for an optional breakfast location for those interested. April's activity will be the toy workshop and May will be a progressive shop visit focused on the Glen Ellyn / Wheaton area.

He wanted the letters to be about 5" high with the overall width around 10". This necessitated that the sign be about 36" long to accommodate the width of the letters. *Doug Carroll* made the



letters out of <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" poplar with his Shaper Origin router. *George Rodgers* made the background from <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" plywood and the frame from modified chair rail. The plywood background was stained dark and finished with shellac. The letters and frame were spray painted gold. The overall size is about 12" tall by 43" long. The two pictures depict the cut out letters along with the finished sign.

Attached are two pics of the walnut cross I built to mount a Jesus figure on. Father Keith gave me the dimensions and requested that it be able to be hung. I cut a keyhole slot in the back and gave him a wall anchor with a #8 screw to fit in the keyhole.




