Library Update Time/Life Book Set For Sale






April 15 DPWW Meeting Chainsaw Carving





Toy of the Month City Car

One of my neighbors has a Smart Car. This cute toy model is a dead ringer. Too bad the brand has been orphaned in the US. This page should print as a full size pattern, you can get wheels and axles at any DPWW meeting, and get a better PDF of the toy on the DPWW web site.

City Car Operation sheet

Material- Poplar, close grain pine or equivalent.

Equipment required. Band saw, Drill press, Router & sandpaper.


Finish-None required-Leave as bare wood.

Other material -Commercial 1" wheels & axles.

Operations:

- Cut wood to size 3 1/2:"L x 2" H x 1 ½" W. Using template trace outline of car on work piece.
- Drill axle holes through. Drill size 7/32"
- Drill window hole through . Drill size 3/4".
- 4. Cut out profile of the car.
- 5. Sand all sharp edges or round over with a 1/8" router bit.
- Assemble axle and wheels. If wood is 1 ½" or narrower you may have to shorten two axles. Check before the glue assembly
- Stand back and admire your craftsmanship.


