New Business:



Toy of the Month Tanker Truck

Another *Stan Anderson* design, this plan makes a tanker truck. Use your creativity to make the truck a flat bed with a box or perhaps a tow truck. A short piece of Stair Rail makes an excellent model tank but any rounded wood could be used. Wheels are specified a bit larger than those used for car toys to better fit with the Truck image.


Material: Poplar, close grain pine, or equivalent.

Equipment Required: Band saw, drill press, router, and sandpaper.

Finish: None, bare wood.

Other Material: Commercial 1½" wheels and 7/32" axles with hub, 4 per truck. For the tank, you will need a 2 ¾" section of handrail, a 5/8" dowel, and a 1/4" dowel.

Favorite Shop Tips and Jigs – September 2024 Meeting

Tips can be small or large things that you use in your own ship. They do not have to be your own original idea, as long as you give credit to the originator.

Do you have a jig to do a specific cut or operation and you use it on a regular basis? Maybe for your table saw or band saw or for your drill press? You can show photos of your tip or jig in use. You can show tips like the one I presented in 2023 from *Alex Snodgrass* that puts a small magnet on a pencil using heat shrink tubing. Alex puts these all around his shop, sticking to all his metal stationary tools. Or things such as circle-cutting jigs for the band saw or maybe a table saw sled.
