# <u>DuPage Woodworkers Board Meeting</u> September 4, 2024

*George Rodgers* opened the Zoom meeting at 7:00pm. Present were Gordon Brand, Jim Harvey, Bill Hoffman, Michael Kalscheur, Bruce Kinney, Jeff Kramer, Tom Kubica, Bruce Metzdorf, Lee Nye, Howard Peterson, Dave Wesolowicz, Steve Young.

**Agenda Additions, Changes and Approval** – The Board voted to approve the past meeting minutes. *Jim Harvey* asked to include a discussion on kitchen duties.

**Treasurer's Report:** (Dave Wesolowicz) – The club has approximately \$5400 in our





accounts. This is after paying \$1200 for insurance and receiving \$800 from the sale of wood donated by *Roger Olson*.

#### Communications:

Secretary – No report

**President** – There will be a St. James school auction on November 8. Members wishing to donate items for the auction should bring them to the October general meeting. The school has not provided guidance as to the type of items.

### **Standing Committee Reports:**

**Membership** (*Mike Kalscheur*) – One new member joined last month, and one expired member renewed. Total membership stands at 209.

**Library** (*Tom Kubica*) – Various new books and patterns have been donated and for the most part, been available to members free of charge at the meetings. A new wheel is needed on the bookcase. Tom is making plans to replace a set of wheels in the next few weeks.

#### Publicity (Mark Wieting) – No report

**Prizes** (*Bruce Kinney*) – First place prize for the September meeting will be a Dewalt sander. Second place will be a Bosch router that is used, but in pristine condition. The router comes with a set of attachments.

**Toys** (*George Rodgers*) – The toy workshop is scheduled for September 28, at the Woodcraft store. Woodcraft is in the process of preparing for their move to a different location. George is monitoring the move to ensure space is available for the workshop.

Newsletter (*Jim Harvey*) – Given the board meeting was pushed back a few days (due to Labor Day) articles will be due by Saturday, September 7. The Rocking Horse will be the Toy of the Month featured in the newsletter. There are 12 FOW projects to be featured in the newsletter. An article on the wood sale put together by Tom and Mike will also be included.

**From Our Workshop** (*Lee Nye*) – There will be three Woodpeckers Six Inch Edge Rules to be given as prizes for the FOW presentations this month.

**Activities** (*Jeff Kramer*) – The toy workshop is the September activity. Plans are still in the works for October and November.

**Programs** (*Bruce Metzdorf*) – September will be for members who wish to share / demonstrate the use

of various jigs and tips from their respective shops.

**A/V** (*Howard Peterson*) – A question was posed about the status of the Microsoft Suite of products. Due to limitations on the administrative function (only one administrator allowed), it appears we will not be using Microsoft, but rather continue with Libre Office.

Web (*Bill Hoffman*) — Updates continue to be made to the web. There is one new classified to be added.

**Tools** (*Gordon Brand*) – Some potential tool sales are in the works. One potential sale will have mainly older tools, and these are planned to be listed in the DPWW classified ads.

#### **Old Business:**

**a.** Roger Olson Wood Sale – *Gordon Brand* and *Mike Kalscheur* – *Roger Olson* donated four (4) pickup loads of wood to the club which were made available to members at very low prices. Roger was very appreciative of the assistance he received from Gordon and other club members in clearing out his woodworking shop. Over the two-day sale, the club took in \$800.

#### **New Business:**

- a. Clothing Sale having inventory on hand The club must purchase a minimum of 6 items at a time from our supplier. This creates significant wait times for orders placed by members. One idea discussed was to purchase a small amount of inventory so that members could receive the purchased items quicker. There is also an issue of the cost that members pay. The objective is to get members wearing the clothing to assist in advertising the club. Other options were discussed.
- **b. Kitchen Duties** *Jim Harvey* Jim suggested the possibility of having a board position / committee responsible for manning the kitchen during general meetings. Jim will put together a job description that can be circulated to members. This evolved into a discussion about upcoming board positions. Mike indicated that anyone not interested in continuing in their role should let him know so that we can begin finding replacements. A suggestion was made to approach new members that may be reluctant to volunteer but may be receptive to helping if asked.

### Favorite Shop Tips and Jigs – September 2024 Meeting

The September 16th meeting presentation topic will be you, the members, showing your favorite shop tip(s) and jig(s) that you use on a regular basis. You can have up to five minutes to present your favorite(s).



Tips can be small or large things that you use in your own ship. They do not have to be your own original idea, as long as you give credit to the originator.

Do you have a jig to do a specific cut or operation and you use it on a regular basis? Maybe for your table saw or band saw or for your drill press? You can show photos of your tip or jig in use. You can show tips like the one I presented in 2023 from *Alex Snodgrass* that puts a small magnet on a pencil using heat shrink tubing. Alex puts these all around his shop, sticking to all his metal stationary tools. Or things such as circle-cutting jigs for the band saw or maybe a table saw sled.



### **Wood Sale Generates Cash for Toys**

Organized by *Mike Kalscheur*, *Gordon Brand* and *Nanette Kalscheur*, the Aug. 23-24 "flash sale" of wood donated to the DuPage Woodworkers drew 25-30 member buyers. On a perfect weather weekend, the Walnut, Cherry, Cedar, Redwood and other varieties laid out on the Kalscheur driveway went fast, in part because the prices were so low. Twelve feet long 12/4 and 10/4 cherry boards went for \$30—per board, not board foot.

Donated by retiring woodworker *Roger Olson*, the wood included some unusual varieties like Ipe and Catalpa. Even a couple Sassafras boards were sold. The sale ran Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. By late morning on Saturday, most of the wood had been selected and carted away.

DPWW secretary, *Steve Young*, commented that he enjoyed the event and liked seeing club members picking out boards for future projects, some planned and some yet to be planned. One buyer said, "I really don't need more wood, but these prices are amazing."

Mike also provided cutting services for longer boards that wouldn't otherwise fit in the buyer's car or truck. After the sale, Mike said, "It was great to see some long-time members and newer ones, like *Rick Ranieri* and *Vaibhav Konanu*r, who both joined within the past month."

Overall, the sale generated about \$800 for the DPWW treasury.

### **August Meeting Recap**

Eric Springer and Dave
Dockstader from the Fox Valley
Woodworkers gave a well-received
presentation on 3D Printing and its
potential applications in a
woodworking shop. There are
industrial applications that print in
metal and even concrete. Hobby
3D printing is an additive process
where objects are built up from a
series of extruded hot plastic
threads. Machines are available for
as little as \$350.

Eric talked about the different types of plastic filament that can be used, applications and printing options. Objects can be printed quickly as a test then slowly for the final version. It can take a long time to print a large object, an entire day is not uncommon.







# **Toy Makers Workshop**

DPWW and Woodcraft will be hosting a toy making workshop on **Saturday, Sept 28 from 9am to 3pm**. NOTE: Woodcraft will have a new location by the time of this toy workshop. They are moving to **504 Ogden, Downers Grove** (one block west of Fairview) the end of August. # Toy of the Month Rocking Horse

Material: 3/4" poplar, close grain pine, or equivalent


Equipment Required: Bandsaw or Scroll saw, sandpaper & glue

Finish: None required, leave as bare

Notation: This is a two (2) piece assembly. One piece is the horse and the other is a rocker.

#### **Operations:**

- 1. Trace horse pattern to wood. Also rocker when made separately. Orient wood grain vertically for strength.
- 2. Cut out horse and rocker pieces
- 3. Sand all sharp edges.
- 4. As this is a two piece assembly you will have to trim the legs of the horse to match the arc of the rocker.
- 5. Glue rocker to horse and clamp.
- 6. Test rocking capability. You may have to do some final sanding to insure the horse rocks smoothly. For more details, real photos, and a Sketch Up file, see the Rocking Horse entry on the Dupage Woodworkers web page.





I've made dozens of these, they are perfect for Christmas tree ornaments. To save grief (my bandsaw breaking blades) I did not cut out the rockers as shown. Instead, I cut strips of wood 4" long and 1/8" thick. I boiled these for a few minutes in an electric tea pot, then clamped the strips around the side of a coffee can. After the strips had cooled about 15 minutes, they were removed and clamped end to end to dry with their coffee can curvature. The strips cut by table saw required far less sanding than if they had been made on a bandsaw.
