Fifty people braved the cold February 17 to attend the monthly DPWW meeting. Plus another five checking in via Zoom.

#### **MicroJig Presentation**



Our presenter for the evening was DPWW member **John Zurales** who last summer completed a commission project for **FGM Architects**. FGMA had inquired if someone in DPWW could make a set of wood conservation awards for their employees. John raised his hand to take on the challenge.

John's presentation featured clamps made by MicroJig. These have a

dovetail shape at the bottom that lock into dovetails cut into a work surface. John manufactured a

dovetailed work surface, and a dovetailed table saw sled to manage repeated cuts of odd angles. Then John engraved the final lettering to the customers specifications with a laser cutter. The process took a couple of months and the client was very pleased with the outcome.

## February 2025 Activity

### **Glenbard East Shop Tour**

Vaibhav Konanur arranged a visit to Glenbard East where Steve Bair hosted the DPWW members in the High School's industrial shops. This included the wood, metal, and engineering shops. All three are large to accommodate students at group workstations.

In the woodshop we saw partially assembled cabinets the students are making and a wide variety of industrial grade power and hand tools. Some would be considered antiques, (as would many of our members).

The metal shop had a similar workstations and a large array of metal working machinery. Currently there are a few CAD milling machines with plans for more.

Mr. Bair explained that several metal shop students compete against students in other schools.in machining parts.

The engineering shop focused on design, CAD, and 3D printing. The shop was equipped with several 3D printers and construction sets to build conceptual prototypes.

Mr. Bair discussed the curriculum and the instructional process he employs, with the #1 thing covered is safety and respect for the equipment.
