## **August Presentation Recap**



#### Christmas ideas in August

Wood turner Mark Dreyer and about 50 club members braved the elements Aug. 17 (thunderstorms) to learn about the many gift items that one can turn on a small lathe with

Mark Wieting can turn on a parts from various suppliers.

Dreyer showed a wide variety of pens he's turned, from acrylic blanks that included images like a dollar bill, fishing line, a picture of a favorite dog and even a '57 Chevy. The whole point is to make a gift special for the person who receives it—like a CPA, fisherman, dog

lover, or car restorer respectively. He prints the

image on an Avery label and sticks it to the pen kit's brass tube before immersing it in resin (plug up the openings!).

Dreyer recommends combining resin and wood you might throw away because of its deficits. The resin and color dyes (such as



3/8" threaded insert

TransTint dyes) can make a project pop. He



showed pepper grinders and various kitchen tools that attach to a common handle he's turned. He turns the handle and epoxies into it a 3/8" threaded insert that connects to gift items like a cheese grater, ice cream scoops, meat tenderizers, pizza cutters, measuring spoons and cup measures.



He uses a 5 gal. pressure pot to set the resin but warns that it "smells up your house." Epoxy, he says, can be used but takes weeks to harden all the way through. For finishes on turned items he uses two coats of gloss shellac, then dries the piece overnight, and puts it back on the lathe the next day to buff with 0000 steel wool, followed by a coat of Gluboost.

He noted that at <a href="https://exoticblanks.com">https://exoticblanks.com</a> there are interesting blanks and that by using the



coupon code "Mark" you can get 10% off. Other offers might also be available.

**Safety:** He always turns with a full face shield and an N-95 mask, and often uses black nitrile gloves. For certain exotic woods such as padauk, he uses a respirator.



Mark has a YouTube channel if you'd like to learn more. Search YouTube for "mark Dreyer pens."

Mark provided his card and offered to speak with anyone with a question, just give him a call.







